- Late entries will be accepted for an extra 20p per class; this rule is strictly enforced.
- On show day, exhibits must be brought to Murcott Village Hall between 8.30am and 10.00am; late arrivals will be refused.
- Guidance for showing vegetables, fruit and flowers is available in the *RHS Horticultural Show Handbook*, 8th Edition.
- Exhibitors may only show produce they have grown themselves; potted plants must have been in their possession for at least two months. The exception to this is flowers in arrangement classes and ingredients in food/drink classes.
- Home Section, Arts & Crafts and Photography exhibits must be the exhibitor's own work.
- Any exhibitor attempting deception will forfeit all prize claims.
- Prizes may be withheld at the judges' discretion if fewer than four entries are in a class.
- The committee reserves the right to refuse any exhibit.
- **Exhibitors may enter only one item per class.**
- No exhibits may be removed before 4pm

BAKING RECIPES

Class 66 Fruit Cake: 285g (10oz) self raising flour, 140g (5oz) brown sugar, 170g (6oz) butter, 225g (8oz) mixed fruit; 55g (2oz) cherries, 2 large eggs, 1 tbsp black treacle, 120ml of milk, 1 teaspoon almond essence. Bake in 18cm (7") round tin.

Class 67 Victoria Sandwich: 4 eggs, 225g (8oz) caster sugar, (extra for dusting finished cake), 225g (8oz) self-raising flour, 225g (8oz) butter, 2 teaspoons baking powder. Raspberry jam filling. Bake in two 20cm (8") round tins.

Class 68 Sticky Ginger cake with lemon icing: 225g (8oz) self raising flour, 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda, 1 tbsp ground ginger, 1 tspn ground cinnamon, 1 tspn ground mixed spice, 115g (4oz) cubed butter, plus extra for greasing, 115g (4oz) dark muscovado sugar, 115g (4oz) black treacle, 115g (4oz) golden syrup, 250ml (9 fl oz) whole milk, 85g (3oz) drained stem ginger, grated, 1 egg. **Lemon icing:** 50g (2oz) icing sugar, 1 tspn lemon zest, 1 tbsp lemon juice. Bake in 18cm (7") round tin, 7cm (3") deep tin.
